This is my last piece for Ascension News. Every time I write or say 'this is the last...' it feels surreal that I should be stepping down from my position as Team Vicar. But after eighteen years as first curate, then vicar of course it feels odd to be leaving. The last few years have been particularly challenging. Covid years, then Philipa's illness, the ministry team getting smaller and smaller for all sorts of reasons, all this has put strain on the parish and on those left trying to hold things together. At the same time the world around us seems to be tearing itself apart. I've often been reminded of the lines from a Yeats poem,

'Things fall apart; the centre cannot hold;  
Mere anarchy is loosed upon the world...  
The best lack all conviction, while the worst  
Are full of passionate intensity.'

The parish and the ChurchatCastle grouping now face a period of considerable change. But through all this change I have found the constants of faith, worship, friendship and community the bedrock on which to stand whilst spinning many plates! For all Christians these things guide our steps on the Way, Jesus' Way, through the inevitable ups and downs of life. I am immensely grateful for all who have helped keep me on the narrow path and been a support in difficult times. The Parish of the Ascension is a remarkable place and somewhere I have been privileged to call 'home'. I know God will continue to keep us in God's sight and care and will ever shelter us under God's wings. I want to leave you with two of my favourite pieces of scripture which have guided me in many stressful times and which you may find useful to contemplate and pray about,

*'Do not be afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom.'* (Luke 12: 32)

and

*'Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither moth nor rust consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also.'* (Matthew 6: 19 -21)

I ask for your prayers and I will ever pray for you. God be with you.






