CELEBRATION OF COMPLETED RESTORATION PROJECTS AT ST GILES

St Augustine's continues to build on its music tradition. Christian Aid Week at St Luke's May 2026



Once again, St. Luke's used the Delivery-Only Envelope system for our Christian Aid Week Collection in May. For countless years we used to do House to House delivery of Envelopes but the digital revolution and the great reluctance in society today to have face to face encounters with other people means the old system has virtually ceased. We delivered the Delivery-Only Envelopes to about half the number of streets covered in the past, with four delivery points for their return. Through these envelopes we collected £880.99. This is a

lower amount than in 2025 but certainly worth doing. We hope that other people donated digitally but we have no way of knowing this. Aid to poorer countries has been much reduced over the last two years particularly as the U.S.A and other countries have stopped or reduced governmental contributions to aid. The need for financial, technical and social support to countries that are already suffering from severe climatic, environmental and debt problems, continues to grow.

Thank you to all who helped deliver envelopes, received them and counted the contents in them, this year.

The traditional Cambridge Christian Aid Supporters Group Thank You Party will be held on Saturday July 18th at St. Luke's from 3pm to 5pm. Everyone Welcome. Come along and enjoy the refreshments and learn more about the good work that Christian Aid does in so many countries besides Kenya, as well as the campaigns for Debt, Justice and Help to overcome the huge Problems resulting from Climate Change.

UKRAINIAN CELEBRATION OF MIDSUMMER WITH COMMUNITY FUND-RAISING EVENT AT ST GILES'



The Kupala Midsummer Celebration for Ukraine, held at St Giles' Church in Cambridge, brought together British, Ukrainian and international communities for an evening of music, dance, food and cultural exchange, while raising funds for Convoy4Ukraine, the local charity providing humanitarian and medical support to Ukraine. More than 100 tickets were sold, and the event has raised £2,573 for Convoy4Ukraine, with the final figures still being counted.

The celebration was co-organised by [ZIRKA Ukrainian Art Hub](#), The Cyriacs and Convoy4Ukraine, in partnership with Aromi. Together, the

partners brought local residents, artists, performers, volunteers and businesses together in support of Ukraine.

The evening was opened by Felicity Spector, the well-known journalist, author and long-standing supporter of Ukraine, who travelled from London to attend. Together with Natalia Yartseva, she welcomed guests with a symbolic sharing of homemade British bread and Ukrainian honey from a local apiary near Cambridge run by a Ukrainian family who rebuilt their lives in the UK after fleeing the war. Guests were also able to sample and purchase the honey during the celebration. The gesture reflected the friendship and solidarity between the British and Ukrainian communities. Perhaps the most memorable moment of the evening was the collaboration between Cambridge folk band The Cyriacs and Ukrainian performers. British musicians and Ukrainian singers shared the stage in performances of well-known Ukrainian songs, while The Cyriacs also learned and performed a traditional Ukrainian piece accompanied by Ukrainian dancers. The performance perfectly captured the spirit of the event — two cultures coming together through music, friendship and support for Ukraine.

Other highlights included the enchanting “Mavky – Forest Spirits” dance inspired by Ukrainian folklore, performed by a group of young participants from YOUkraine Teens as well as a lively ceilidh which brought guests of all ages onto the dance floor.

Visitors also enjoyed traditional Ukrainian food, artisan products and Aromi’s popular Italian gelato, served by Francesco Genovese. The Cambridge-based business joined the celebration as a community partner, contributing to the fundraising effort for Ukraine.

Ukrainian artists also played an important role in the event. Maryna Butko and Yulia Feofanova presented artwork inspired by the traditional Samchykivka and Petrykivka decorative painting styles. Artist Iryna Haslam created the decorative Kupala Gateway, an embroidered heart installation and other artistic elements displayed throughout the venue, helping to create a distinctive visual identity for the celebration. The atmosphere of the event was further enriched by two Ukrainian florists, whose beautiful floral decorations transformed St Giles’ Church into a colourful midsummer setting and became one of the most admired features of the evening.

Visitors also enjoyed traditional wreath-making activities, a charitable raffle featuring prizes from Ukraine, and the evening concluded with the traditional Kupala fire-jumping ritual in the church garden.

The event demonstrated how culture, community and shared traditions can bring people together while continuing to support Ukraine during a difficult time. It also highlighted the growing contribution of Cambridge’s Ukrainian community to the cultural life of the city.

NET ZERO CARBON

What is net zero and why is it so important?

Put simply, net zero means cutting carbon emissions to a small amount of residual emissions that can be absorbed and durably stored by nature and other carbon dioxide removal measures, leaving zero in the atmosphere. The science shows clearly that in order to avert the worst impacts of climate change and preserve a liveable planet, global temperature increase needs to be limited to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels. Currently, the Earth is already about [1.2°C warmer](#) than it was in the late 1800s, and emissions continue to rise. To keep global warming to no more than 1.5°C – as called for in the [Paris Agreement](#) – emissions need to be reduced by 45% by 2030 and reach net zero by 2050. (United Nations, Climate Action)



Despite many leaders and politicians now retreating from the commitments they made to reach net zero carbon emissions by 2050, the Church of England is holding firm to its plan to achieve net zero carbon as an organization by 2030 –

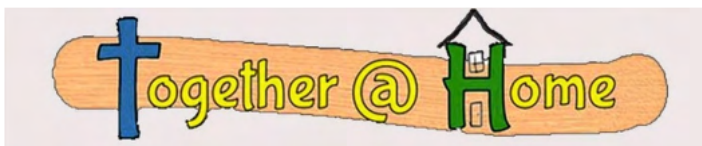

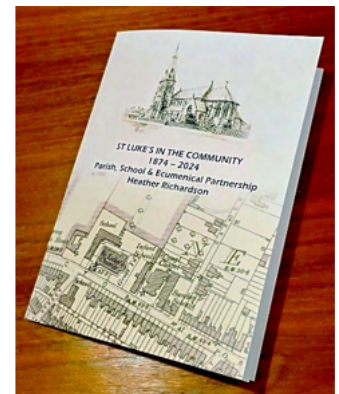
